Based on the poem by John McCrea

Lieutenant Colonel John McCrae, a Canadian surgeon, tended to those injured in the Second Battle of Ypres in April 1915. He wrote the poem after one of his closest friends was killed. McCrea noticed that wild poppies were already beginning to bloom between the simple wooden crosses marking the many makeshift graves.

The poem led to the adoption of the poppy as the Flower of Remembrance for the British and Commonwealth war dead.

McCrae was buried with full military honours in Wimereux Cemetery near Boulogne, France; the main street in Wimereux is now named Rue McCrae.
